Entry 2 and Entry 3 Award, Certificate and Diploma

Duration: **Up to 370 Guided Learning Hours.**

These qualifications are accredited by Ofqual at Entry 2 and Entry 3 on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF). It also forms part of Foundation Learning. The purpose of this qualification is to develop a wide range of personal, inter personal and work related skills, learned through the context of vocational areas.

Award - The minimum requirement for this qualification is six credits (60 GLH)

Certificate - The minimum requirement for this qualification is 22 credits (220 GLH)

Diploma - The minimum requirement for this qualification is 37 credits (370 GLH)
