At LRAC the Step Up qualification forms part of an individualised entry level vocational learning programme. The units chosen are designed to help learners with their basic skills reinforcing functionality. The step up qualification is a first step, helping learners settle into college life and learning.

Methods of Assessment

The assessment for these qualifications are through practical observation and questioning through an assessment set up by the awarding body, you will be required to build up a portfolio of evidence with help from your tutor which will be marked internally and externally verified.

The NOCN Step Up Qualification enables progression to further learning opportunities, this could include:

- Higher level qualifications.
- Progression to employment (On its own Step Up is not vocationally related)
